CLASSROOM Educator's Tips

When the subject (主語) is **third-person singular**¹¹ in the **simple present tense**¹², we add an extra '-s' or '-es' to the verb.

e.g. Sarah **plays** the piano and **watches** TV on Sundays.

For the negative statements, we add '**does not**' to the verb **instead**¹³.

e.g. Tiffany **does not** like coffee.

For the verbs *to be* and verbs *to have*, we change the form to '**is**' and '**has**'.

e.g. The baby **is** happy. She **has** a lot of toys to play with.
