Life as a Doctor

Have you ever wondered how a doctor helps a patient? Do you know what a doctor is responsible for? It's certainly a meaningful job. However, it is not as simple as we think.

Caroline Jackson is an American doctor who has a lot of experience in treating patients with different illnesses. 'I'm a doctor working in Australia now. I first need to examine patients carefully and find out the cause of their illnesses. Then I have to make the correct diagnosis in order to give them the appropriate treatments. After their treatments, I still need to monitor their health condition to ensure that they are in good health. Therefore, I take my job seriously as I'm responsible for people's lives,' said Caroline.

To become a doctor, you must attend medical school to equip yourself with the necessary medical knowledge. In addition, you need to receive proper training and work as a medical trainee in hospitals to gain hands-on experience. Although a medical degree is needed to become a doctor, it is not a must to receive specialist training if you just want to be a general practitioner or a family doctor that provides patients with basic medical care. Besides, you need to have good communication skills as you need to explain to patients clearly about their health condition and the treatments they need to receive. You also need to have good leadership skills to manage your medical team in order to help patients effectively. Most importantly, you have to manage your time well. **It** helps prioritise your work, so that you can start dealing with the most urgent or important task first,' said Caroline.

Being a doctor is an amazing job as you can help others in society. 'Besides having medical knowledge and experience, you need to be passionate about your job. To me, it is **'the most important thing'** to do. Although I enjoy being a doctor, I feel quite lonely sometimes as I don't have time to meet my family and friends,' added Caroline.

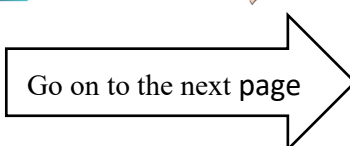
