

## Track 01

- Narrator: Primary Five. Listening Assessment. Part A. Timmy is a naughty child. Last night, he dreamt of a fairy asking him to behave well. Listen carefully. Circle the correct answers and fill in the blanks with the correct words.
- Fairy Ann: Timmy, I'm Fairy Anna. You are so naughty that many people don't like you. If you don't change your behaviours, bad luck will follow you forever!
- Timmy: (*scared*) I don't want bad luck to follow me... but... I don't know what I did wrong.
- Fairy Ann: Let me ask you. Yesterday, Kristy stepped on your toes accidentally. She didn't mean to and she did say sorry. But what did you do to her?
- Timmy: I scolded her angrily because it was her fault! She should walk carefully.

- Timmy: I promise I will try to get on with people. \*
- Fairy Ann: You should also help your mum at home. Don't let her do all the housework. You can always do some housework after you finish your homework. But you never try!
- Timmy: I'm too lazy. I promise you that from now on I will help Mum do housework every day. \*
- Fairy Ann: But you also need to be tidier. You put things everywhere, especially on your desk. It is so messy that you can't even find your homework. Last week, your mum even found a cockroach on your desk!
- Timmy: (*shocked*) Oh! That's disgusting! I promise I will tidy my desk once a week.
- Fairy Ann: Timmy, remember to do what you've promised and good luck will follow you. \*

## Track 02

- Narrator: Part B. Miss Wong saw a thief break into her house last night. She is telling the police about the thief. Listen carefully and complete the form.
- Officer: Good afternoon, Miss Wong. I'm Officer Li. To help with our investigation, I'm going to ask you a few questions. First of all, when did the thief break into your house?
- Miss Wong: Last night.
- Officer: Today is the 21<sup>st</sup> of April, so I'll write down the 20<sup>th</sup> of April then. \* Do you remember the exact time?
- Miss Wong: Um... I arrived home at about 8 pm and when I tried to open the door, I saw the thief. He was climbing out of the window. \*
- Officer: OK. And the name of the building that you live in is Good View Building. Is it correct?
- Miss Wong: Yes. \*

- Officer: He must have stolen a lot. Can you remember if he wore glasses or a mask? As you said you could not see his face clearly.
- Miss Wong: No... I don't think so. It was just too dark. I couldn't see what he looked like but I'm quite sure that he didn't wear anything on his face or head. \*
- Officer: How about gloves? Did he wear any gloves?
- Miss Wong: No he didn't and I think that was why he hurt his fingers when he was climbing out of the window. He actually screamed quite loudly. I think he even left some blood on the window.
