> E ach year millions of people enjoy animated movies. It is a <u>genre</u> with a long history, and has been around for about as long as movie has. The first known animated cartoon ever made was created in 1908. By the 1930s, cartoons were being shown at movie theaters before major **feature** movies. In the 1950s, cartoons became most commonly shown on TV. Animated movies that were as long as movies had been made even before 1937. However, most people consider *Snow White and the Seven Dwarfs* as the first **successful** full-length animated movie.

> Traditionally, these kinds of movies are drawn by hand. Each scene must be drawn several times with only slight changes. Then the pictures are photographed. When each image is rapidly **projected** in order on the **screen**, people can see the characters moving. As you can imagine, making these kinds of movies took an extremely long time and a lot of patience. Today, with **advanced technologies**, the drawings are mostly done on computers. There are **programs** that create **smoother movements** and clearer pictures. Most of the animated movies nowadays are three-dimensional. **Textures** such as hair are depicted in **details** that as the years go by, each new animated movie appears more **realistic** than before.

> In the past, animated movies were mostly **targeted** at children. They usually aimed at **delivering moral** messages to the young audience. Nowadays, the genre reaches a wider range of **audience**. Some of the movies **convey** messages that only adults with life experience can comprehend. PIXAR, a famous animated movie **production studio**, made movies based on topics that most adults find **meaningful**, say love, dreams and family. Over the years, animated movies have truly evolved.
