Rescuing Lives, Restoring Hope

Did you know that hundreds of cats and dogs are left behind by their owners every year? To keep these stray animals safe, kind-hearted people have set up animal shelters. At the shelters, the animals are prepared for a better future. Let's explore what animal shelters actually do.

The main job of an animal shelter is to rescue animals from the street. Staff and volunteers work around the clock tirelessly to look for stray animals. At the shelter, they feed the animals and clean them up. Any sick or injured animal is treated immediately.

Once the animals are well enough, shelters will let people adopt them. However, they do not just allow anyone to adopt rescued animals. 




